Purpose

The purpose of this position as Psychologist is to provide professional psychology services to children and adults on the autism spectrum and their families.

Responsibilities

- Implement a range of evidence-based interventions that are responsive to individual client needs and inform development of creative, person-centred solutions
- Conduct assessments for developmental, cognitive and emotional functioning and contribute to multidisciplinary functional and diagnostic assessments
- Work as part of a multidisciplinary team to conduct Functional Behavioural Assessments and develop, implement, monitor and review Positive Behaviour Support Plans
- Prepare and maintain assessment, observation, progress reports and other documentation as required
- Work collaboratively with other Autism Queensland psychologists to continuously improve the interventions delivered by these professionals and the overall quality of services provided by Autism Queensland
- Participate in relevant community and professional networks
- Provide training and information for parents, colleagues and other professionals regarding the role of psychology for children with ASD and their families

- Effective Positive Behaviour Support Plans developed and informed by Functional Behavioural Assessment

- Demonstrated evidence-based practice across all aspects of service delivery

- Case management skills with demonstrated experience in establishing effective helping relationships, conducting assessments, developing intervention plans and working together with clients to provide support and meet identified needs
- Knowledge and experience of a range of intervention strategies relevant to children and adults with ASD
- Excellent interpersonal and sound written communication skills
- Demonstrated commitment to person-centred approaches
- Proven ability to maintain work quality and performance during tight schedules

- Training and experience in administration of the Autism Diagnostic Observation Schedule (ADOS) and Autism Diagnostic Test (ADI-R)
- Experience working with children and adults with special needs and/or ASD
