Evidence-informed, holistic and family-centred therapy groups for young children.

We understand the unique needs of young autistic children. Our EarlyAQtion Early Childhood Groups are designed to provide a structured, supportive and therapeutic neurodiversity-affirming environment where all children can thrive and participate.

Every group is led by an Occupational Therapist, Speech Pathologist, or Teacher, known as the 'Group Leader,' and supported by two dedicated EarlyAQtion Assistants. They work closely with families to ensure the best outcomes for each child.

Additionally, the group may be supported by a combination of other therapists or teachers, based on the group needs and service location.

Development areas for your child may include communication, self-care, emotional regulation, tricky behaviour, social participation, and more. These groups are:

- Tailored to meet each child's specific needs and strengths.
- Safe, structured, and high ratio of staff to children, determined by the needs of the children and centre facilities.
- Inclusive, supportive and delivered in a welcoming environment.
- Designed to explore your child's individual strengths and interests to motivate their learning and develop skills that are meaningful and useful.

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Small group structures foster inclusion and promote positive participation and interaction.

Young children attend EarlyAQtion Early Childhood Groups during school terms, with most joining at the beginning of the school year and attending for at least 12 months.

Staffing varies according to the number and support needs of children in the group, ensuring each child receives the appropriate level of care and attention.

- All children receive an individual assessment before enrolment.
- We recognise that parents are essential team members in their child's development, so we collaborate closely to set and review goals, ensuring continuous progress.
- We use a positive approach to behaviour support that focuses on understanding the reasons for all behaviours, promoting a constructive and empathetic learning environment.
