Workshops are scheduled across the year and delivered **face-to-face or online**. Additionally, **customised sessions are available** upon request (subject to scheduling).

Alongside an introduction to PBG, topics include: understanding behaviour, positive relationships, regulation, and strategies for success. Follow-up sessions are also available to expand on the foundational knowledge.
